#### **Grange Park**

Autumn has well and truly arrived and the trees in Grange Park are starting to turn. It's always lovely to see the reds, oranges and yellows indicating that the seasons are changing. This is the short, colourful time before the leaves really start to fall. There is something a little melancholic about the falling of the leaves and the resulting bareness of the trees, though who doesn't like to kick through some crunchy leaves on a crisp autumn day especially when, unlike in our own gardens, we don't feel the need to get them all raked up before they go soggy.



October was a busy time in Grange Park with a group of us setting 150 wild primrose plug plants in the Heritage Orchard area. Hopefully these will give a good show next spring right after the native daffodils have finished. They should naturalise in there and get better year on year.

We also sowed yellow rattle seed in the main wildflower area. This should help to keep the wild grasses down and give wildflowers a better chance of coming through.



Thanks to everyone who helped with that too.

#### Play Area Improvements Coming Soon!

Exciting changes are underway at our village play area!

The enclosed wooden structure featuring tyres and monkey bars have been removed. and the area will be turfed in preparation for new grass matting, which requires the turf to settle beforehand.



The existing equipment has significantly aged with splitting wood and rising repair costs and following regular safety inspections, the council has opted for a safer, more inclusive replacement.






#### **Speed Awareness in Scothern**


Residents continue to raise concerns about the level of speeding in Scothern. The following table shows the maximum speeds recorded by the three speed cameras in Scothern during 2025.





# Reverend Paul Maple, Churches of Welton, Dunholme and Scothern War and Remembrance

Earlier this year we commemorated the 80th anniversary of the end of the Second World War, beginning with VE day on Thursday 8th May, the end of hostilities in Europe; and culminating on Friday 15th August, VJ day, the date of the Japanese surrender. On both occasions, veterans united with Royalty, Heads of State, serving military and others, to remember the fallen and to give grateful thanks for their sacrifice.

Few can fail to be moved by the sight of those faithful remaining veterans, gathering still, despite the distance in many cases, to remember those left behind; equally, the stark image of war graves, fields of immaculately maintained white crosses, standing row upon row, stretching far into the distance.


With the end of hostilities, British, Commonwealth and allied forces began the mammoth task of demobilisation and returning the former service personnel to their homes, though we should remember that thousands remained on active service for many years in the newly liberated Europe, occupied Japan and throughout South East Asia as the new world order was established. Sadly, nationalist struggles began to emerge, or re-emerge almost immediately, as old tensions came to the fore once again.

As ever, with the increasing passage of time since the end of WWII, particularly in this 80th anniversary year, allied to dwindling veteran numbers, there are those who call for an end to such commemorations of the two world wars in order that we can look forward, rather than back. However, our nation, like many others, made a solemn promise to remember the sacrifice of those who have gone before. Equally, the hoped-for peace dividend never really happened and today the armed forces remain as necessary as ever for the preservation of our way of life. Though I have said it before in these pages, it bears repeating that sadly, since 1945

there have been only 2 years in which British military personnel have not been killed on operations. Whilst corporate memory of global war fades with the years, major conflicts are proliferating increasingly once more, even in Europe. Meanwhile largescale re-armament is taking place in many countries and the prophet Isaiah's vision of 'swords beaten into ploughshares' (Isaiah 2.4) seems as distant as ever. We forget the all-too human cost of war and conflict at our peril. Taking time out to remember at this time of year is not only keeping our promise to honour the fallen: it is part of our commitment to future generations not to follow the same blood-soaked path again and our duty to search for a better way.

I hope you will join us at our Remembrance Day service this year, which will take place on Sunday 9th November at 10.45, beginning at the war memorial. There will also be a further service at Welton war memorial on Armistice Day, 11th November, again beginning at 10.45

We will remember them.

What's in a Name?

The singer Dionne Warwick, famous for songs such as That's What Friends Are For and I'll Never Love This Way Again, was not always known by that name. She was born Marie Dionne Warrick. But when her first record was pressed, a mistake on the label changed "Warrick" to "Warwick." She was assured it would be corrected—but it never was. And so, the name stuck.

This sort of thing is surprisingly common. Over the years, I've heard many stories of family names being altered by accident. One wedding I officiated particularly stands out. The paperwork for the groom didn't quite add up, though the Registrar had issued all the necessary certificates. After much investigation, we discovered the truth: the gentleman had been given the wrong adoption papers 67 years earlier. He had been living his entire life under a name that wasn't legally his.

As you can imagine, it caused some complications. The first was the shock of suddenly discovering a "new" name. The second was that I had to legally marry him under it—though, to his friends and family, he was still the man they knew and loved. Thankfully, everything was resolved, and in the end, much laughter followed—just like Dionne Warwick's story.


Names matter. They are personal and significant. I have always been Richard, and my mother simply ignored anyone who called me Rick or Ricky. Names can connect us to history, express family ties, or carry meanings and hopes chosen at birth.

When Juliet famously said, "A rose by any other name would smell as sweet," she meant that a name doesn't change the essence of a person. Dionne Warwick remained the same talented singer she always was, and the groom was still the man his bride had fallen in love with, whatever his legal documents said.

But sometimes names carry more than just identity—they carry purpose. As a minister, I also bear the name Christian. It is more than a label; it speaks of who I am and how I strive to live. Does my life reflect the teachings and character of Jesus? That is the question I must ask myself daily.

Many of us in our community carry that same name. Together, may we live in a way that truly honours it.

#### **Parish Council News**

- War Memorial refurbishment there have been a few hurdles to jump, the PC have paid the faculty fee, agreed to pay towards adding the missing names and are currently awaiting the Diocesan Advisory Committee to sign off the faculty to allow it to proceed.
- External Audit for 2024/25 Completion of the limited assurance review for the year ended 31 March 2025 has been received. The external auditors report and certificate has been published on the website and notice board at the village hall.
- LCC have agreed to hard surface the footpath between Sudbrooke Rd and Orchard Close. The PC request was to tarmac this but highways have said this is too costly but will place a frost resistant, stain free type 1 mot in the near future to improve the surface and keep it mud free.
- Flooding Prevention the pipes under Grange Park have now been jetted, flushed and cleared. LCC have been jetting & repairing the drains/gullies on Church St to Sudbrooke Rd and Main St. The PC are awaiting the report on these works. 3<sup>rd</sup> Witham Drainage Board maintain the beck and have a vegetation maintenance scheduled between now and December.
- Scothern's Emergency Plan is awaiting the final stage from the Lincolnshire Resilience Forum. More details to follow.
- A new bench has been purchased and positioned at the village hall, for parents/carers to sit and watch their children while they play on the new equipment.
- The new roads proposed for West Thorne Grange, the Nettleham Rd development, will be West Thorne Drive and Swynford Close.
- Grange Park 2 dead trees to be removed.
- The footpath from Church St to Grange Park to be repaired.
- A Remembrance Wreath will be placed on the War Memorial at the Remembrance Sunday Service by Cllr Jane Johnson on behalf of the parish of Scothern.

Parish Council Meetings take place on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Wednesday of each month (no meeting in August) at 7.30pm in the Methodist Chapel. Each meeting has a 10-minute public forum, during which members of the public may make a short statement to the Council in relation to matters on the agenda, matters of concern or interest.

If members of the public have any matters that they wish to be discussed, they should submit them to the Clerk one week in advance of the meeting so that it can be added to the agenda. 
